Steinert grads Fink, Foy tabbed best at their positions by NJAC coaches

It was a proud day for Hamilton Township girls' soccer and, in particular, for Steinert High School when the New Jersey Athletic Conference announced their award winners this week.

At The College of New Jersey, former Spartan standout Allison Foy was named the NJAC Defensive Player of the Year. Down at Rowan, Foy's former Steinert teammate Christie "Fish" Fink was tabbed as the conference's Midfielder of the Year. Both were first-team All-Conference.

The selections were voted on by the league's 10 coaches.

A two-time NJAC all-conference pick, Foy started all 15 matches for the Lions, who will meet Stockton in the NJAC Tournament championship game. The junior back anchors TCNJ's defense that currently ranks tied for the conference lead in fewest goals allowed (9).

Against NJAC competition, Foy and the Lions' defense surrendered just five goals in nine league games played.

Fink, a senior midfielder who went to Rowan after one year playing for DePaul, is also a two-time all-NJAC selection. With an ability to slip past defenders the way cars with EZPass glide through toll booths, she helped the Profs claim the NJAC regular-season championship with an 8-0 mark in conference play. Fink currently ranks 20th in the NJAC in points (13), and fifth in the conference in assists (7) and against NJAC competition she ranks second in conference-only assists (6).

Making the second team is Kean senior back Lauren Small, a Hamilton West graduate.

One other Steinert grad has made an impact in the post-season, as TCNJ senior midfielder Nikki Migliori scored on a direct kick one minute into the second half to give the Lions a 1-0 win over Montclair in the NJAC semifinals. Migliori beat a Red Hawk team with former Spartans Melissa Koster and Jess Belmont on the roster.

TCNJ hosts Friday's final against Stockton, an upset 3-2 winner over Rowan in the other semi. The Profs (13-4) will find out on Monday if they get an at-large bid to the NCAA Division III tournament.

Also on Rowan's roster is freshman Vicky Camera, a Hamilton West product. Camera has scored two goals and an assist this year.
