Schultz's goal just enough to send Steinert past Hamilton

Sep. 20: Chelsea Schultz has a 100 percent goal-efficiency rating.

Actually, there's no such statistic, but we're making it up right now, and what it means is that 100 percent of Schultz's varsity goals have been game winners.

Chelsea notched her first varsity score today and it proved to be the only one of the match as Steinert took a 1-0 victory at Hamilton.

"We had a lot of opportunities, we just missed them," said Schultz. "We have all the set plays down, but we're having trouble with finishing."

But the junior midfielder had no difficulty midway through the second half, as Adrianna Boucher dropped a pass to Schultz around the penalty kick line, and she sent it into the left hand corner.

Steinert held on from there in sending Hamilton to its fourth straight loss and extending the Hornets scoreless streak to 325 minutes.

It snapped a two-game losing streak for Steinert (2-2), which was coming off a 1-0 loss at Peddie Saturday.

"It was good to get a win," Schultz said. "We just got another boost of confidence for our game Thursday (against West Windsor-Plainsboro South).
