Steinert gains six pins against Ewing to record eighth straight victory

Jan. 18: The Steinert wrestling team had little trouble winning its eighth straight match as it rolled to a 70-10 victory over Ewing tonight.

Steinert notched six pins in the match from Joe Paragon (132 pounds), Brandon Bernstein (152), Sean McDonald (170), River Ullrich (182), Luis Leon (22) and Michael Remboski, who pinned in just seven seconds at 285 pounds. Bernstein, McDonald and Leon all planted in the first period.

The other points for Steinert (8-3) came via forfeits.

Nottingham eyes Hightstown after rolling past Allentown

Jan. 17: Nottingham faces Hightstown in a key CVC Valley Division clash Saturday as part of a tri-meet that includes Bordentown.

The Swamprats improved to 14-2 overall and 7-1 in the CVC with a 42-28 win tonight over Allentown. The squads split the 14 bouts, but the Rats got all seven of their wins by pin. The Redbirds had just two falls.

Josh Magee (106), Justin Dempsey (132), Waleed Abouelela (145), Kevin Simon (160), Wroway Williams (195), Kevin Meneus (220) and Hector Comulado (285) had the wins for Nottingham.

Williams improved to 14-2 and is tied for the team lead in wins with Jancel Nunez, who is 14-3 at 170/182. Abouelela is 13-4 while Magee and Dempsey are 12-4.

Hightstown enters Saturday's match with the Swamprats off a 34-34 criteria win Wednesday over Allentown. The Rams are 12-3 overall and 8-1 in the CVC.

In addition to meeting Hightstown this weekend, Nottingham has remaining CVC matches against Trenton, Robbinsville, Steinert and Ewing. The Rams still have West Windsor-Plainsboro North, Hopewell Valley and Trenton on their schedule.
